The team was involved in several community volunteer

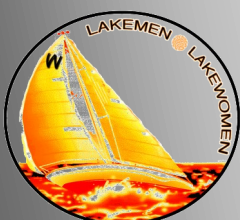

## Boys Junior Varsity Continues Strong Improvement

The 2015-16 basketball season has been an exciting, successful one for the JV Lakemen. Having to replace a very talented group of starters from last year was no easy task. That coupled with losing the teams 2 starting point guards within a week of one another (one to Varsity and one to injury) left the season's future success in question. Nonetheless, the JV Lakemen put in a tremendous amount of time and effort leading to a 14-5 overall record, including an 11-3 mark in the league. The team is 2nd in the NO league, behind only undefeated CSAT who narrowly beat them in overtime in January. The team's balanced scoring attack is led

by sophomores Jared Carney and MacGregor Musall (8 points per game each), Zander Heim (7 ppg) and Matthew Daul (6 ppg). These 4 along with the rest of the Lakemen, not only can put the ball in the basket, but they play great defense as well, averaging outscoring their opponents 56-41.

The season has had many high points and thrilling moments, including beating a tough Medina team twice, holding on for a 1 point victory over Roy-Hart and besting rival Newfane in front of our home crowd. The highlight though was a 1 point come from behind victory over Medina. The Lakemen fell behind 18-5 after the first quarter and could have

easily packed it in, but instead they made a commitment at that moment to stop playing the game WITH each other, and start playing FOR each other. Cutting into the lead each quarter and finally taking the lead on a free throw by Jared Carney with 4 seconds left. The victory helped show the team that the belief they have in their teammates and the power of banding together is what breeds a championship mentality. While the teams 5 starters will need to be replaced next year, Freshmen Cal Seeley, Jackson Rotella and Jake Miller have played valuable minutes and will look to keep the wins coming for the basketball program.

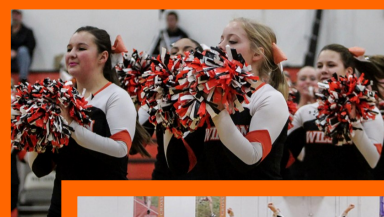
## Wilson Cheer Team Shows Competitive Spirit

The Modified Boys basketball team would like to thank Mr. Roth and all who had anything to do with making room for Modified Sports in our athletic department. It was worth it!

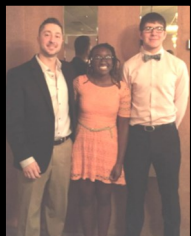
## Wrestling Looks To The Youth
