## Lakemen Football Led by Record-Setters

The 2017 Wilson Lakemen Football team made it one step closer to the stadium this year by putting together a 5-4 winning record for the season. Statistically, according to maxpreps, Quarterback Steven Frerichs led all passers in the state Class C with a single season school record 1,664 yards. Steven also set school records with 21 touchdowns and 126 completions. Having another record setting year, Marcel Wilson beat his own record by receiving 10 touchdown passes. Helping the Lakemen with their record setting year were catches by Brayden Dunlap, Tristan Guthrie, Jared Carney, Tanner Feeley, Wade Rick, John Bender, Drew Westmorland, and Trevor Zahno. Although the Lakemen threw the ball well, they ran the ball better than they have in many years. The offensive line consisting of Cody Greenlief, Joe St. Onge, Andrew Francioli, Frank Diszenza, and Matt Lange opened huge holes for the running game.

## Cross Country Teams Have Great Finishes

The 2017 cross-country season was a memorable one for both the boys and girls team. Both teams showed tremendous improvement and worked hard all season.

The boys' team finished the season 8-4 and were the 10<sup>th</sup> ranked team in the final WNY Small School Coaches Poll. Junior William Schwarzmuller who was a first team all-league selection again this season led the team. Nathaniel Johnson and Quinn Rees had strong races at the all-league race and were named honorable mention all-league. Cal Seeley and Jon Montgomery were consistently top 5 runners. Sophomores Jon Moote and Alex Martinez along with freshmen Al Schultz showed great improvement from last season and were major factors in the team's strong season. With 8 runners returning next season, the team has an opportunity for an even stronger season next fall.

## JV Boys Soccer Wins Some, Learns Some

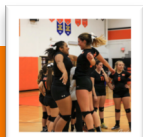

# Varsity Field Hockey Shines

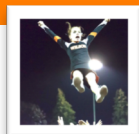
Varsity Field Hockey finished the season tied for 4th in the league. We had a league record of 5 wins and 7 losses. Our overall record was 6-9 and we also placed 2<sup>nd</sup> this year in the Barb Field Tournament in Kenmore. Many players received individual recognition for the Lakewomen, including: Hannah Day and Emilee Muoio nominated as Honorable Mention All-League, Olivia Mitchell selected as 2<sup>nd</sup> team All-League and Honorable Mention All-WNY, and Maddie Mocarski selected 1<sup>st</sup> team All-League and Honorable Mention All-WNY.

Placing amongst the top of league players was Hannah Day, who earned 6<sup>th</sup> in the League for scoring with 7 goals and 1 assist, while Lizzie Soles and Maddie Mocarski earned 9<sup>th</sup> with 4 goals and 1 assist. Goalkeepers, MJ O'Connor and Sam Perry placed 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> out of 12 goalies based on their average of goals allowed per game. MJ had 48 saves allowing 12 goals; Sam had 29 saves allowing 12 goals. The girls also shared 4 shutouts this season. The team had another successful Play 4 The Cure game in October and were able to donate \$495 to Cancer Research.

The Wilson Varsity Volleyball Team had an outstanding year finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Niagara Orleans League with a 6-4 league record and 8-7 overall. Captains Raechel Blasius led the team in kills (59), Jenny Myers in aces (34), and Brooke Wisor in digs (143). Isabel Dinse improved tremendously this season ending with an incredible 69 blocks at the net. Madelyn Seeley led the team in assists (92) and was one of our top players all around with 29 aces, 36 kills, and 97 digs. Sarah Nugent (21 kills and 35 blocks) and Meg Musall (31 kills and 15 blocks) both contributed greatly at the net and Julia Johnston and Anna Frerichs both stepped in to put up a significant defense earning 84 and 79 digs respectfully. We had three players make the All-League Teams with Raechel Blasius making 1<sup>st</sup> Team, Isabel Dinse making 2<sup>nd</sup> Team, and Jenny Myers Honorable Mention.
