National Junior Honor Society Travels to Disney World

This year, 15 members of the National Junior Honor Society traveled to Walt Disney World in Orlando, Florida. The students took one of Disney's Youth Educational Classes at the Magical Kingdom.

The class, Property of Motion Physics, brings the Magic Kingdom alive in a whole new way as students

experience first-hand scientific principles at work at Space Mountain, Buzz Lightyear's Space Ranger Spin, and Big Thunder Mountain Railroad. They started off by learning about the scientific method and an introduction to Sir Isaac Newton's Laws of Motion. The students explored the ideas of inertia, potential and kinetic energy. An activity and riding on Space Mountain showcased how these concepts and the laws of physics contribute to the thrill of Disney's rides.

The students then moved into the world of storytelling and the role of pneumatics and hydraulics that create life-like movements in many of Disney's characters. Buzz Lightyear's Space Ranger Spin provided the experience the students needed to see pneumatics and hydraulics in action. The students were able to use an air pump, switch and two levers to create the action of a pneumatic.

The last experience brought on the discussion where inertia, gravity, and centripetal force create a thrilling ride. The students were able to use a sphere and marble to demonstrate centripetal force and see that without the top of the sphere, the marble would fly out. This helped demonstrate the need for safety on rides and how lap bars and restraints affect your inertia. The students got to experience how your inertia is affected by riding Big Thunder Mountain Railroad.

Throughout the three-day stay at the happiest place on earth the students, along with some siblings and parents, were able to enjoy the many experiences at Disney's four major theme parks. They ended their trip with a dessert party at Epcot's World Showcase Loch Side Pavilion and enjoyed that evening's Illuminations: Reflections of Earth show.

Wilson Announces Its Orangemen **Award Winners**



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
