If the expectations are met - YOU WILL BE SUCCESSFUL!





- Prepay plan available if you would like to purchase snacks or an additional lunch



Eligibility

PARENT/SCHOOL COOPERATION

- Call the office (not your student's cell phone) if you need to get in touch with your student. (Personal Electronic Devices Prohibited.)
- Contact the office with concerns



Parent/Teacher Communication/Cooperation

- Teachers and Parents must form a team to create a home/school connection. Teachers want what is best for your child.
- If you have a question or concern, it is imperative that you do not hesitate to speak with the teacher.
- Encourage your child to meet all school expectations.
- Encourage your child to dress appropriately.
- Keep lines of communication open.
- Contact the middle school office with any concerns.

Parent/Teacher Communication/Cooperation

- Parent Meetings:
- I suggest all parents schedule a meeting with the grade level team, especially parents of students who possess an IEP or 504 accommodation plan.
- Please see Mrs. Phillips to schedule a meeting.
- Parent meetings will be scheduled beginning September 9th.
 - o 6th Grade Team Meetings: 8:50 9:20 (2nd period)
 - 7th Grade Team Meetings: 9:30 10:00 (3rd period)
 - o 8th Grade Team Meetings: 10:15 10:45 (4th period)

What is the best method of communication with teachers?

- Schedule a meeting with the grade level team. If a meeting cannot be arranged, communication via phone or e-mail is the best alternative.
- Most teachers check email on their planning period and are able to respond more quickly than a meeting or phone call.
- In-person meetings are preferred and tend to be more beneficial to student learning/improvement.

How are parents notified of their child's progress?

- Contact your child's guidance counselor or teacher.
- Parent Portal A 'doorway' into school database giving families access to information about their children.
 - Attendance
 - Grades
 - School bulletins.
- Parents are able to participate more fully in their student's progress, and teachers can use their gradebook to communicate with parents and students.

What are the procedures for the Middle School?

- Appropriate student behavior is outlined in the student handbook. Students and parents are required to read the student handbook.
- I will visit each Social Studies class during the 2nd week of school to discuss 'Points of Emphasis' regarding academic and behavioral expectations.
- If the agenda becomes unusable or is lost, please contact Mrs. Phillips for a new one at a cost of \$5.00.



How will I know what my child has for homework?

- All students are given a student handbook, commonly referred to as the agenda, in which to copy their homework assignments. Parents should check their child's agenda each night to see the required homework.
- Grade level teams post homework/assignments to Google Classroom.
- It is the student's responsibility to inform parents of their homework, future projects, tests, and quizzes.

Are students permitted to use cellphones in school?

If a student does not follow this rule, what happens?

- <u>First Offense</u>- the student will be referred to the office, a warning will be given, and the student will pick up their device at the end of the day.
- <u>Second Offense</u>- the student will be referred to the office, a 2nd warning will be given, and the student's parent/guardian may be asked to pick up their device at the end of the day
- <u>Third Offense</u>- the student will receive 1 day of ALC for insubordination, a plan will be made in partnership between the school and the family to either store the device in the office each day or to leave it at home. The student's parent/guardian may be asked to pick up their device at the end of the day
- <u>Fourth Offense</u>- the student will receive 3 days of ALC for insubordination. The student's parent/guardian may be asked to pick up their device at the end of the day
- <u>Fifth Offense or more</u>- the student will receive 5 days of out-of-school suspension for insubordination. The student's parent/guardian may be asked to pick up their device at the end of the day

What is the deadline for adding/dropping band or chorus?

• Students who wish to add/drop band or chorus must do so no later than September 22nd. Students must have a signed note from the parent and there must be room in the class before any change is considered.



When and where can I drop off my child?

• 7:40 is the best time to drop off students. *Please do not send students in earlier as we do not have supervision prior to 7:40.*

STUDENTS MUST BE DROPPED OFF IN FRONT OF THE ZIPP GYM HALLWAY ENTRANCE - **Door L**

When and where can I pick up my child?

- 2:35 is the best time to pick up students if your child is leaving after 9th period.
- If your child is staying 10th period, 3:15 is the best time to pick up your child.

Students being picked up by their parents must be picked up in front of the Zipp gym.



ATTENDANCE

- If your child is tardy or absent, you will receive a text message and/or phone call generated by PowerSchool. You can respond to your child's absence or tardiness by the following:
 - o Call the Attendance or School Office
 - Respond to the text message with a return text
 - Send in a written excuse
- If your child is to be dismissed early, please do one of the following:
 - Send in a written excuse and have your child take it to the Attendance Office or School Office prior to attending 1st period. Students will be given an orange dismissal card to show their teacher when they are to be dismissed.
 - Call the Attendance or School Office. Phone calls for early dismissal are only accepted from parents and/or guardians.
 - Email the Attendance staff, allowing time between the email and the dismissal time. Emails can be sent to sanderson@wilsoncsd.org or mshank@wilsoncsd.org.
 - TEXT MESSAGES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR EARLY DISMISSALS.
- Chronic Unexcused Tardiness will result in Detention and/or ALC assignments.


