What is AIS?

Academic intervention services is a state-mandated program designed to help students who are struggling to achieve the learning standards in English language arts and mathematics in grades K-12 and social studies and science in grades 4-12. These additional general education services include:


- Extra instructional time to help students achieve the learning standards in the subject areas requiring AIS, and
- Support services to help students overcome barriers that are affecting their ability to learn, such as attendance problems, family- related issues, discipline problems and health-related issues. Support services could include school guidance and counseling services to improve attendance and coordination of services provided by other agencies. (www.nysut.org)

How do students get assigned to AIS?

Many factors contribute to a student's placement in AIS. These factors include:

- Performance on state assessments
- Classroom performance
- Data from a variety of skills measurement resources
- Teacher recommendations
- Counselor recommendations


RTI Response to Intervention - MTSS Model



Students are screened, tested, and observed. Data teams identify student strengths and weaknesses.

Numbers for Tiers 2 and 3 should drop, while Tier 1 and advanced should grow.

Numbers for AIS support are few. Students are still monitored and will receive AIS as needed.



Student progress is continuously monitored and tracked. Those not responding begin the RTI (Response to Intervention) process.

Students are monitored and receive ELA/Math AIS instruction based on NYS test scores and classroom performance.
