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# Updates

<u>Shared Decision Making Team</u>- The Shared Decision Making Team met in March to do a reflection on the March 20th Superintendent's Conference Day. We listed all of the positive elements from the day and then listed any changes we need to consider for the future. Also in the proposed calendar for next year, there are two staff development days scheduled. To assist the Shared Decision Making team in setting up the two staff development days for next year, a list of PD topics will be sent out. What we are asking is for assistance in prioritizing the topics.

**High School Principal Hiring Update**-The posting closed on Friday, March 29, 2019. We had 31 applicants for the position. This week we are working on getting the hiring committee together. Next week I will be meeting with the administrators association president to narrow the applicant pool down. The on May 1, 2019 we will conduct Round 1 of the interviews. The goal is for the person to be in place starting July 1, 2019.

**Capital Project Update**- Work will be beginning soon on the Capital Project. A company will begin over Easter Break with work at the Elementary school nurse's office. The first order of business is that over break they will be removing the tile floor. Now that the weather is getting better, the site work for the new field and track will begin. You may have noticed the construction vehicles on the practice fields between the track and the Elementary school. The plan was for this week to start removing the track.

**Capital Outlay Project 2019-2020**- We have finalized our plans and have begun submitting for next year's capital outlay project. We are going to create a secure entry at the Middle School. Along with the secure entrance, we are beginning to replace the hallway flooring in the Middle School. During spring break, the 6th grade wing will be done this year. During next year's capital outlay project, we will continue from the 6th grade wing past the front entrance of the Middle School. The current floor is old and has outlived its usefulness.
