



<u>Capital Outlay Project 2018-2019</u>- This year as part of our budget, we have a small outlay project scheduled. The work will be in the HS/MS server room and Technology office. The scope of the project is the air handling and air conditioning unit in the server room and the replacement of the rugs in the technology office. The project has been approved by State Ed and it went out to bid. The work should begin prior to January.

<u>Capital Project 2017-2020</u>-Now that the playground pull-out project is completed, we can turn our eyes to the rest of the capital project. The rest of the project has been in review by State Ed for about 3 weeks. We expect to have final clearance to go ahead in the next 4 weeks. We are hoping to begin the bidding process by October. If everything goes through as expected, we would break ground in the Spring of 2019.





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<u>District Goals</u>- We have a draft of our District goals that were reviewed at the September 25 Board workshop. They will go to Board vote in October.

Educational Study Council- Part of the responsibility of the Educational Study Council is the creation and monitoring of the mentoring program and professional development opportunities. I met with the Educational Student Council recently and we discussed the creation of two subcommittees. The first subcommittee was created to review and update our District Mentoring Program. That committee met one time so far and began that work. The second committee will be the District Shared Decision Making team. That team will be charged with looking at the District goals and implementing an overall District plan for professional development.
