Connor Seeley was the team's most consistent golfer all year, earning him All-League honors. Coach Kurtz is looking forward to another strong team next year with many of the boys coming back from this year's team.

Varsity Football Still Working Hard

Even though the Varsity Football Team is sputtering a bit this year, the team continues to improve. Because of the off season time the team put in at camps, young players are seeing some considerable playing time and contributing well. Jeff Mazur, Alex Fox, John Carney III, Nick Thuman, and Jacob Rice are underclassmen
