## Wilson Lakewomen Soccer Takes 4th Straight League Title

The Girls Varsity Soccer Team won its 4th consecutive league title with a league record of 13-1. They begin Sectionals rated number #2 in WNY in the small school's poll and #7 in NYS Class B. Their highlight win of the league came against arch rival Newfane. Trailing 2-0 at halftime the girls stormed back scoring 4 goals in the first 15 minutes of the 2nd half. The girls held off Newfane with a 4-3 win. The girls are seeded 2nd for sectionals and will play East Aurora to open up play, the

team that eliminated the Lakewomen last year.



The team is led by its captains Zipporah Barrett, Lauren Courturier and Leah Herman. These girls have done a great job of building team chemistry and keeping their teammates

focused. The scoring leader is Kayla Neumann who leads the N-O league with 23 goals. Jen Darlak and Rachel Senek have also had strong offensive seasons with 13 goals each. Junior playmaker, Emily Paterson is 2nd in all of Section VI with 22 primary assists. Emily Kelly has proven to be one of the best goalies in WNY.

The girls hope to reach their goal of a sectional title, which would be their first since 2001.

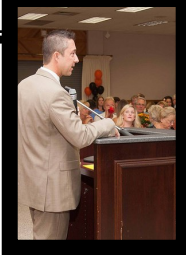

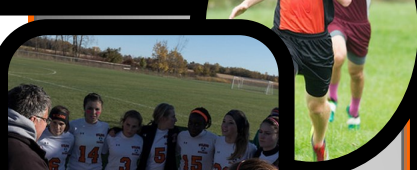
