Varsity Softball Poised To Make Waves

What the 2018 softball team lacked in experience, they made up for with heart. This green team had a fantastic work ethic and performed with pride, both in practice and in games. Five returners served as captains for the young squad of fourteen, including: seniors Madison Goodnight and Madeline Mocarski; junior Isabella Schultz; and sophomores Emilee Muoio and Anna Frerichs. Anna Frerichs led the team from the mound this year, pitching about 75% of the 100 innings of play, throwing nearly 1,500 pitches.

Offense was a strength for this year's team, as they had some of the highest batting averages (as a group) in recent history. Eight players finished the season with a .300 or better batting average! Leading the way was freshmen Madelyn Seeley, who batted a team-high .383 and earned a spot in the record books (tying for 4th place) for most doubles in a season (8), which is an honor also shared by her assistant coach, Elise Jancef. Also having impressive seasons at the plate were: Alycia Thompson, with 13 hits and 13 RBIs (.271); Isabella Schultz, with 17 hits and 11 RBIs, and 14 runs scored (.354); Julia Faery, with 16 hits and 11 RBIs, and 11 runs scored (.333); Anna Frerichs, with 14 hits and 9 RBIs (.318)

Once aboard, Meg Musall and Isabella Schultz stole the most bases this season with 9 each, and Julia Faery was right behind them with 8.

Defensively, the girls truly played as a team this year, with solid performances across the field. Behind the plate, Julia Faery had a stellar year with a fielding percentage of .986, which earned her a spot in the record books (tied for 4th place) alongside Maddy. First year outfielders Kenzie Beyer, Meg Musall and Stephanie Woolson, along with senior right fielder Madison Goodnight, each made some monster catches and relays to the infield for outs. Shortstop Emilee Muoio came back from a foot injury stronger than ever, making diving plays across the infield and consistently putting balls in play at the plate. Senior Madeline Mocarski was unable to physically play an inning, since she was recovering from surgery, but her leadership skills were a vital ingredient in keeping her young teammates motivated and resilient.

Although the team ended its season with a 5-10 record, there were many impressive moments along the way. With so many returners coming back, the future of the softball program at Wilson looks very bright. Coach Mahar invites the two graduating seniors (along with all previous alumni) to come back and work with the young 'uns anytime!
