The Wilson Golf completed the 2021 season with a league record of 2-10, placing 6th in the league. Despite struggling to put together wins in the matches, all players improved throughout the year attaining various personal goals.

Nathan Meyers led the team finishing 2nd overall in Niagara Orleans league play and qualified for sectionals and 1st Team All League for the third straight year. Nathan was also selected as team MVP for the second straight year. Michael Bubar had a strong finish to the year finishing tied for 5th in the league tournament and 2nd Team All League. Michael won the sportsmanship award. Nathan and Michael will be a strong one two punch in the league as seniors next year.

Sophomore Grant Dixon, a newcomer to the team, had a successful first season. Grant competed in 8 of the 12 matches and continually improved throughout the season, and received the Coach's Award. Senior Richie Meyers, and 4 year letter winner played in 10 of 12 matches and will be greatly missed next year. 7th Grader Ben Meyers played in every match and finished 20th in the All League Tournament. CJ Humphrey rounded out the team and showed marked improvement competing in the Novice Tournament and several exhibition matches.

Boys Varsity Soccer Led By Seniors

With a roster filled with experience and Senior leadership, the 2021 team went into the season with big goals and had an extremely successful season. After just missing out on the League Title, the team went into Sectionals as the 4th overall seed. After a dominating win in the quarterfinals against Chautauqua Lake, the boys eventually fell in the Semifinals against #1 Seed Lafayette International.
