Hello Parents and Guardians

Welcome back to Wilson Middle School, we are your nurses Mrs. Walch and Mrs. Barnum. We are here to help you have the best year possible. If it's medication at school that your child needs, a quick band-aid fix, or an ice pack we are here for you. We're also here to make sure the kids are healthy and safe and we can do that by making sure vaccines and physicals are up to date. Below is break down of what we need to help make the process easier.



Or did I?

What shots does my child need for school, and how can I make this process easier?

-There are specific years that specific shots are needed. The good news is that out of 7 years here only 3 years are the shot years. The bad news, this is one of those years, however after this year you can forget about vaccines until 12th grade.

Children entering 7th grade will need to have their Meningitis shot before starting 7th grade, (we do have a 14-day grace period that state allows) The good news here is that it may have been administered at your child's 11 year well visit, so it's possible that your child got the vaccine already! If you're not sure your doctor can let you know, or you can call us in the clinic to see if we have a record of it.

If your child needs medication at school

-We are able to administer prescription and Over the Counter medications as long as we have a (1)Doctor's order for the medication,(2) Your signature allowing us to give the medication, and (3)the medication in the original box that it came from the pharmacy in . We can then store the medication safely in the clinic and make sure that if your child needs it, it's here for them.

Yearly Physicals

-We ask that you provide the clinic with a copy of your child's physical so we have a record that they are healthy and cleared to participate in physical activities. The great thing about electronic medical records is that most offices can fax it right to us at 716-751-9597 and you don't have to do any running around. *Email is also a great option swalch@wilsoncsd.org or ebarnum@wilsoncsd.org. We will be offering physicals at the school on 8/15/24 for sports and 11/13/2024 for mandated school physicals. For all kids where scheduling conflicts have occurred this is a great option.

**Injury notes-We hope it doesn't happen but with active kids, comes injuries at times. If your child is injured and needs to be out of gym/sports or needs accommodations to be successful in school, we can make that happen for you. Please send us the doctor's note via fax or drop it off and we'll take care of the rest!

SEVENTH GRADE SERVING LEARNING PROJECT

Thank you to former Town Historian *Mr. Charles Horton* for stopping by to meet with a group of seventh graders this spring. The students are in *Mr. Sippel's* Social Studies classes, and they are researching a local legend centering on Luther Wilson, the son of town founder Reuben Wilson. According to the legend, Luther was a young teenage boy who was in the fields tending to the family's cows when British soldiers marched through Wilson during the War of 1812. To prevent the soldiers from hearing them, Luther stuffed dried leaves inside the cows' cowbells and drove them east, along what is now Route 18. Mr. Horton loaned the students a binder full of materials to help them with their research, and was also kind enough to meet with them in person to answer questions they had.

The group is proposing the installation of a new 'Legends and Lore' historical marker in the community, sometime during the 2024-25 school year. The marker program is offered through the Pomeroy Foundation, and this will be the second historical marker that Mr. Sippel's students have pursued. A marker featuring Lake Island

Park was secured by former student, *Jesse Rodgers* in 2019, and is currently installed near 1 Shore Drive in Wilson, by the entrance to the Tuscarora Yacht Club.

Through their participation in the project, Mr. Sippel's students may earn New York State's new 'Seal of Civic Readiness', when they graduate. Hopefully everyone will be able to enjoy a shiny, new red and silver marker in Wilson sometime next year! For more information on the Legends and Lore program, please visit:




